Aims of teaching

- 1. Introducing the students to cognitive-behavioral psychotherapy, its specifics, and its place in the canon of psychotherapy modalities.
- 2. Educating the students on the general cognitive-behavioral theory and its assumptions underlying the specific variants and modalities of CBT treatment.
- 3. Familiarizing the students with the disorder-specific CBT formulations based on verified theory and empirical effectiveness results.
- 4. Teaching the students the basic areas of CBT competence, including structuring the session and carrying out a case conceptualization, as well as self-reflexivity and continuing of education.
- 5. Introducing the students to the notion of collaborative empiricism in CBT.
- 6. Showcasing the most popular cognitive and behavioral interventions, their rationale and procedure, basing on clinical vignettes.
- 7. Showcasing the general structure and plan of CBT for mood and anxiety disorders.
- 8. Coaching the students in thinking about clinical problems and decisions in the language and conceptual framework of CBT.
- 9. Presenting the latest developments in "third-wave" CBTs.
