**Aims of teaching**

- Introducing the students to the fundamental philosophical and epistemological assumptions of the science of psychotherapy.
- Placing psychotherapy in the wider historical, social, and scientific context.
- Familiarizing students with the similarities and differences between the major contemporary modalities of psychotherapy, as well as with general empirical data concerning their effectiveness.
- Providing an overview and description of basic counseling competencies (e.g., establishing the therapeutic relationship, including patient cultural factors into the case conceptualization, etc.)
- Bringing to the students' attention the ethical issues in psychotherapy practice, as well as highlighting the importance of continued self-development.
- Cautioning the students to the prevalence of suicidal behaviors and suicide and the need to react appropriately to specific warning signs of suicide.
- Educating students on the necessity of recognizing and combating pseudoscientific mental health treatments and fallacious arguments concerning mental disorders and psychotherapy.
- Informing students about the best practices of incorporating cultural factors into psychotherapy (age, gender, race, ethnicity, religion).
